Hello,

Yesterday, February 22, was the Feast Day of the Chair of St. Peter. In celebrating the chair of St. Peter, we are reminded of his position as the one Christ entrusted to lead the young Church. The chair is the position of authority from which official teachings and declarations are to be made. In celebrating this today, it not only reminds us of Peter's position and is meant to unite us as a Church to Peter and to Christ, but also to remind us of the continuation of that position, of that authority, of that connection to Christ through the Pope.



In the First and Second Vatican Councils, the topic of the infallibility of the Pope was addressed. I remember hearing about (I won't ask how many of you remember this personally from that time) when John F. Kennedy was running for President of the United States, that some were concerned that, since he was Catholic, he would just do whatever the Pope said. I think most Catholic politicians, and most of us Catholics at large, could testify that this isn't the case. And while it probably should be more often for most of us, this is often an exaggeration of the Church's teaching on the infallibility of the Pope. The Pope is only considered to be infallible when he is speaking '*ex cathedra*,' which means, 'from the chair' (of Peter). That doesn't deny the authority, obedience, and respect that we should give to other statements by the Pope, but only when he speaks *ex cathedra* does it need to be considered infallible.

The chair, or *cathedra*, also needs to be recognized as not just the seat of Peter, or of the Pope, but is the term we use to speak of the position of each bishop. The term cathedral is the church that holds the *cathedra* of the bishop. Even when Pope John Paul II came to St. Louis and visited our cathedral, he didn't sit in our bishop's chair, but we did have a nice one for him to use.

The date of the feast was originally celebrated on January 18 and February 22 with January 18 being the date when it is believed Peter gave his first sermon in Rome. It is also associated with a physical chair connected to St. Peter that was located in St. Peter's in Rome, and February 22, when it is believed that he gave his first sermon in Antioch, which is associated with a physical chair from the catacomb of Priscilla. Another possible source for the date is suggested to be an ancient practice in Rome to set out a chair to commemorate dead relatives and friends between Feb 13-22. I only found this in the Ordo, the booklet that tells me what prayers and feasts to use each day of the year, and it has this note about The Feast of the Chair of Peter.

One other note – since Lent is just around the corner you might consider watching a short video on Formed.org called 'How to Lent – Back to basics.' It is only 13 minutes, but brings up a few good things to consider before Lent, like maybe giving up the hardest thing for Lent isn't necessarily the best thing to give up. I know that got my attention.

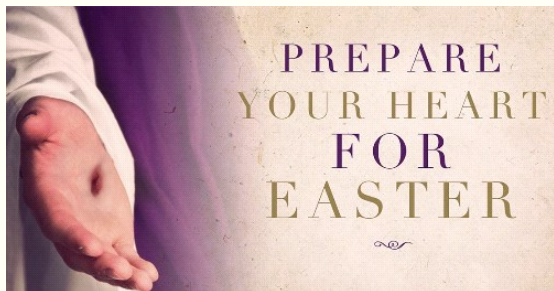

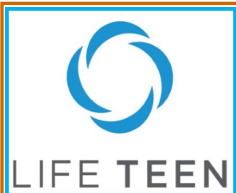
