Hello,

Next week, we celebrate Palm Sunday. Since I usually focus on something else coming up during Holy Week in that bulletin, I thought I would give us a little preparation for Palm Sunday today. The Church's official title for the day is "Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord," which includes the two main parts that are different for this Sunday that are to a level that we all are aware and remember them – the palms in the beginning of Mass and the reading of the Passion at the Gospel.



The Mass is preceded by the commemoration of Jesus's entrance into Jerusalem. When people enter the church, they pick up palms, which they will keep as a part of this commemoration. This can take place in a procession from another church or suitable location, and then the procession leads to and into the church, or as we normally do it here, done as a solemn entrance that will be contained within the church building.

Instead of processing up to the altar, the priest will begin at the baptismal font with a greeting and then a blessing of the palms, moving through the church to bless the palms that all in the Church are holding. After this, the Gospel is proclaimed of the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem where he is recognized and honored. If you look at the Gospels, you will realize that this isn't immediately followed by the Last Supper and Jesus' crucifixion, but there is a period of Jesus teaching in Jerusalem before those occur.

The Gospel reading is then followed by what is termed a solemn entrance. For this, we encourage all who are mobile to come back to the Narthex (entrance) of the church, follow the priest, deacon, and servers in procession towards the altar, and then return to their seats. At most parishes I have been simply the priest, deacon and servers would process in, but the size of our Narthex and layout of our church allows us to more fully participate in a procession, even if we are not coming from a distant place from the church itself. The Church considers this important enough that it is clearly set out in the Roman Missal that provides the prayers and instructions for the celebration of Mass, and I think it is fair to say it does help us to recognize the special nature of this day and to enter into the special time of Holy Week.

When we read the second Gospel for this Mass, the reading of the Passion of Christ, it is normally done in parts, with three parts, the Narrator, the Voice, and Jesus, being read by different ministers, and then the congregation reading the part of the Crowd. In some ways, the reading of the Passion on Palm Sunday has always seemed strange to me, as we will also read it on Good Friday, and it even includes the Last Supper, which we celebrate on Holy Thursday. This can seem a little redundant, but on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, we are able to focus more on just those specific events, and on Palm Sunday, it provides good preparation for the entire period of Holy Week.

The instructions in the Roman Missal for after the reading of the Passion says, "a brief homily should take place, if appropriate." The previous instructions before 2011 had stated, "a brief homily may be given." You will get to find out next week how the priest interprets that instruction.

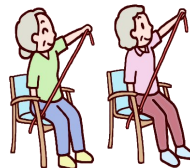
PRAY THE ROSARY BEFORE WEEKEND MASSES

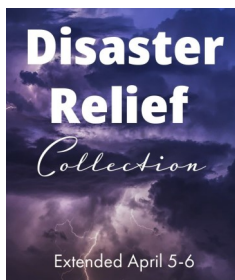

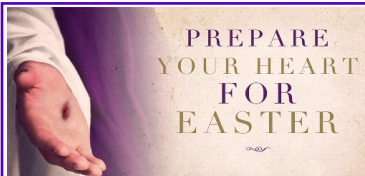

HOLY WEEK BEGINS PALM SUNDAY, APRIL 13



Holy Week happens on the last week of the season of Lent and is the most important week of the year. It begins with Palm Sunday and continues through [the Triduum](#) of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It is a time for prayer and marks the final stretch before Easter Sunday on April 20, the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection. Join us as we commemorate and remember the last week of Jesus' life on this earth.

April 13: Palm Sunday
Mass at 8am, 10am, noon and 5:30pm, Church

April 17: Holy Thursday, Mass of the Lord's Supper
Mass at 7pm, Church

April 18: Good Friday
Life Teen Walk the Way Stations of the Cross at 3pm, Church

April 19: Holy Saturday Easter Vigil

This evening we renew our baptismal promises and celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation with those who have been preparing as we witness their Baptisms, entry into the Church, Confirmations and their First Communions.

April 20: Easter Sunday
Mass at 8am, 10am, and noon, Church; Mass 8:15am and 10:15am, Chapel
The season of Easter is the most important of all liturgical times, which Catholics celebrate as the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church.

Each week that we celebrate the Rite of Scrutiny, as we have for the past two Sundays during Lent, we are invited deeper and deeper into a great mystery that affects all people. 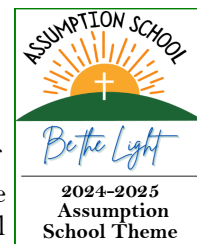

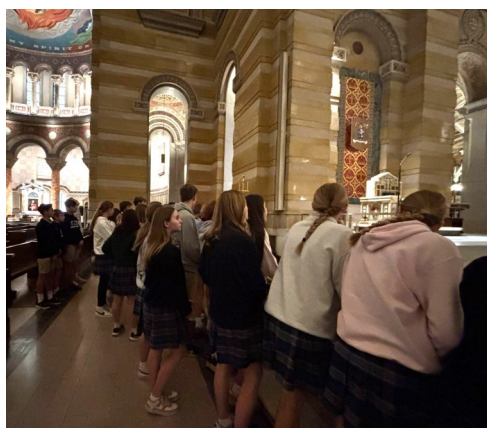
A WORD FROM HOLLY WOYTUS, DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

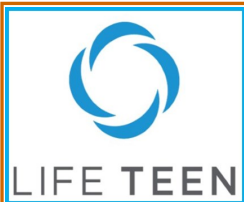
