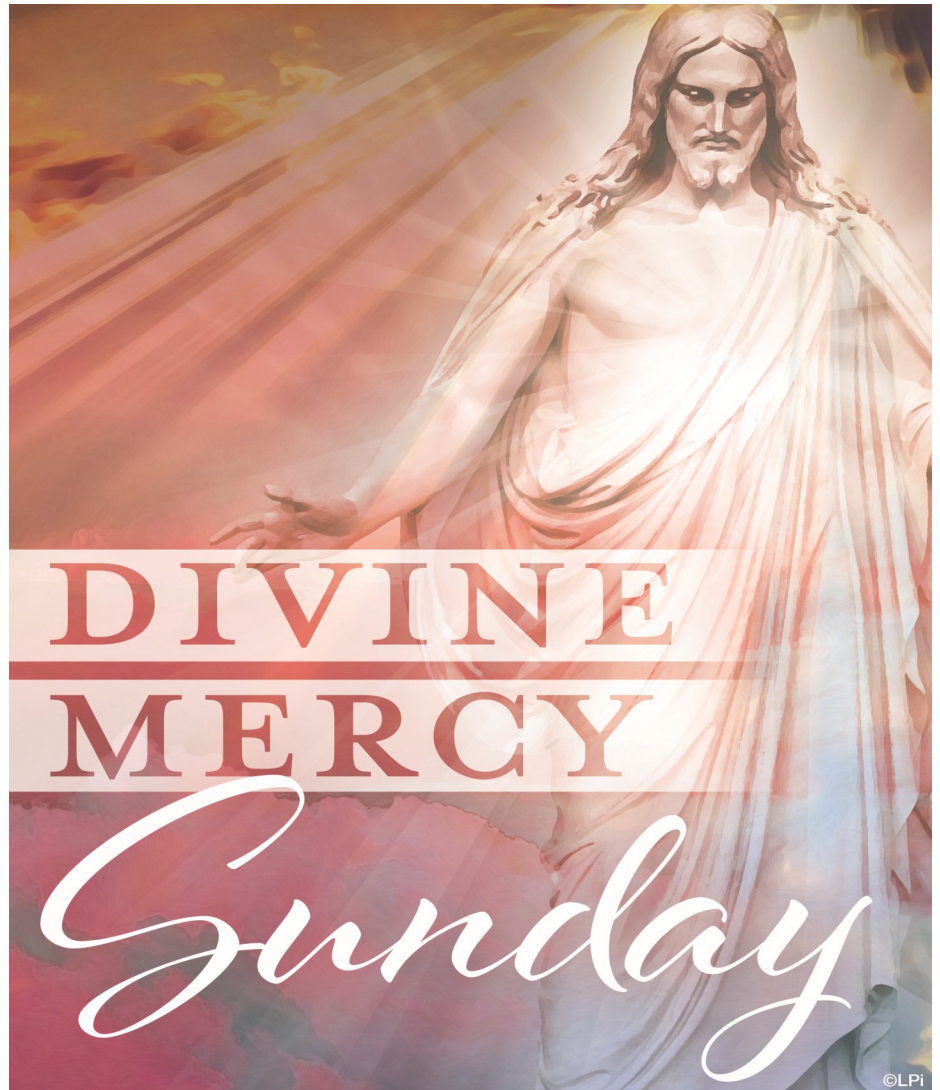

Hello,

Lent is over and now we are in the *Season* of Easter. That's right, the Season. Last Sunday was Easter Day, this past week has been the Octave of Easter, but the Easter Season goes all the way up to Pentecost. I focus on the season because unlike just a day or an octave, a season, like Lent, is a period that we might look to make some change. But unlike Lent, when we can be a little more focused on avoiding temptations or overcoming some sins, why not consider being open to the blessings and joys God offers in our lives?



When Mary Magdalene comes to the tomb and eventually recognizes Jesus, Jesus tells her, "Stop holding on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father." (John 20:17) Maybe we can listen to these words of Jesus this Easter Season. How can we let Jesus change in his relationship to us? We consider all relationships need to change if they are to grow, how can we do that with Jesus?

The first thing is always to take some time and be open to what the other is saying. The weather is getting nicer, how about just taking the time to walk through the neighborhood, or a park, or even just taking a few minutes of sitting in a sunny spot each day and reflect on the joys from the past day, the blessings from God in our lives? Or maybe thinking of the opportunities you had to help someone else? That God worked through you? We can let these moments just go by without notice, or recognize them, appreciate them, be more ready to see these opportunities when they come again, so we are sure not to miss them.

Sometimes God works through us for others, but other times he might be working through others for us. Maybe there is a specific person in our lives that we haven't appreciated as much as we should. And since we are getting kind of close to the end of the school year, if we are in school in some manner maybe that is a teacher or someone else in a school, or a fellow parent who helps us out, or we have just been realizing how gifted we are in certain subjects or in our opportunities in life. We can just go along taking things for granted or be grateful to God and the people who are helping us.

Jesus told Mary Magdalene, "I have not yet ascended." We realize he is talking about heaven. I think it is very hard to imagine the type of joy God wants for us in heaven, so let's start by being open to the joys he wants for us already today.

ASSUMPTION PRAYER CHAPEL




Adoration is available 24/7 in the Chapel (the old church) by using the code at the north transit entrance. You can call or come to the Church Office to receive the code.

Please join us in Church 30-minutes before each weekend Mass for the Rosary (except 5:30 pm Mass on Sundays.)





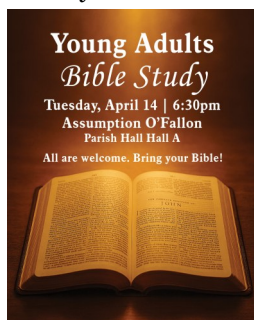
YOUNG ADULTS MINISTRY BIBLE STUDY

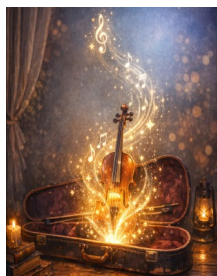

Did you know?

On September 10, 1929, Assumption Junior High School was transformed into a four-year high school program and opened for classes. The new high school was dedicated by Monsignor Aloysius Wilmes on September 22, 1929.

A frame building was erected containing three classrooms, which included a science room and a typing room for the Senior High operation. This building was later moved from this location by the Knights of Columbus, and today houses the Knights of Columbus in a new location.

In 1930, Assumption High School operated on a three-year basis, and the following year it expanded into a four-year high school. It was fully accredited on May 14, 1930 by the State High School Inspector, Dr. J.E. Ellif. From its beginning, the school was under the tutelage of the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood, and had 27 students in attendance the first year.

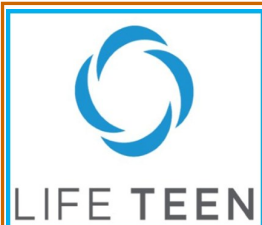
How the numbers stack up for the 2026 Lights, Camera, Trivia event:
