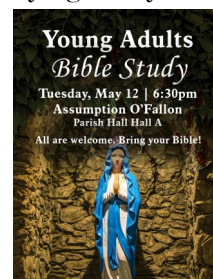

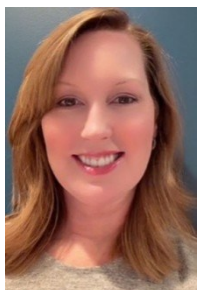
5. Theresa McDonough

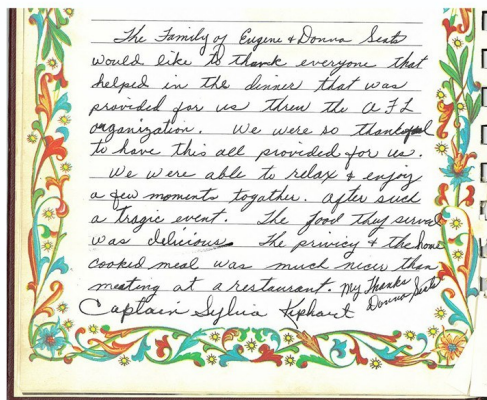

Did you know?

On June 18, 1984, the Assumption Family Lunch (AFL) Ministry, now called Funeral Luncheon, was approved by the Parish Council at the Church of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Under the leadership of Rev. Theodore Bunnert, parishioner Sylvia Kiphart was asked to start this much needed parish ministry along with four captains, including Rosella Schneider, Elaine Wilmes, Cathy Stankey, and Jan Eckholdt.



The first AFL was held on July 27, 1984 in the lower hall of the O'Fallon Knights of Columbus #2269 following the funeral of Eugene Seats. Each captain provided three to five dishes to serve to the 30 guests in attendance. The ministry quickly grew to 25 members assisting each of the five captains, and it's still going strong today with Pattie Begley and her amazing team leading the way. Thank you to all the volunteers who have assisted with this beautiful ministry over the years.

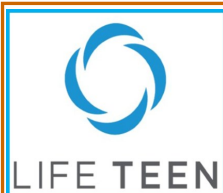

CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (FORMERLY RCIA)

Since the Easter Vigil, we reached the fourth period of the OCIA process, which is the neophyte year. All who were baptized and received into full communion are called neophytes until the anniversary of their initiation next Easter. The final period of weekly formation extends through the Easter season, the seven weeks from Easter to Pentecost. This post-baptismal catechesis is called mystagogy. It is as time for deepening the Christian experience, especially in appreciation for the sacramental life, for spiritual growth, and for entering more fully into the life and unity of the Catholic Church. The neophytes now share with Christ, and his Body in the parish community, the intimate communion of the Eucharist. Now they have access to all means of sanctification.
