Hello,

Yesterday, Bob Hennekes, from Assumption, was ordained a priest and then immediately after, told where he is being assigned (since I'm writing this a few days before, I don't know where that is yet.) A very big change in his life, but one he has been preparing for and expecting now for many years. This is a time of year we associate with graduations (from all levels of school and not just the seminary), with weddings, and what can be major changes in our lives. Each of these things can be challenging, (graduation, weddings, ordination), ending of one period and the beginning of something new. Possibly involving moving, new jobs, a new way of life. Even if we are not going through one of these this year, just the beginning of the summer season (and I'm talking about Memorial Day to Labor Day, not strictly the calendar summer) can be a shift in our daily lives.



No matter what kind of change we may be going through, even if it is just seasonal, it is also a good opportunity to look at our lives and consider where our faith is in it. One easy thing we can always check is the time we spend on prayer and devotions in our lives. Summertime might be a period when we may be a little more active than other times of the year. Instead of a quiet indoor activity, our prayer may be part of a daily walk or other activity. Maybe with the long days, we realize that it is easier to get up a few minutes earlier or to move our place from the living room to a quiet place in a garden or on a deck for quiet reading or reflection.

If you might be up for a bigger change, the archdiocese is promoting a new program they are starting this summer called Missionaries of Joy. (www.archstl.org/missionaries-of-joy) Not quite the commitment of going to the seminary, but this is a fairly involved commitment for next year. Even if you can't do this entire program, looking it over might inspire you to do something else (more information on this is in the bulletin). Most significant changes in our lives aren't things we just saw and suddenly did, but rather took some steps on that path before committing to it.

Maybe, at this time, a more important thing to consider is our direction in our lives. As many of the changes we may experience may not only apply to daily routines, but also affect the direction our life is going. Do we take the time to consider if this direction is taking me closer to God or not? It might be a situation where we realize we will have a whole new set of decisions and responsibilities. Are we willing to consider the moral aspects of all these decisions, the challenges they may present? Along with the benefits of most positions, from jobs to relationships, come risks and sacrifices, what are the type of things that may be asked of us and what are we willing to do?

Whatever changes you may be going through, hopefully you take it as a chance to reflect on your life, and the great eternal life that God intends for each of us.

Congratulations Fr. Bob on your ordination and know we are here to support you in your changes, and hope to support each other in whatever changes we may be experiencing.

CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (FORMERLY RCIA)

This weekend, we talk about the sacrament of Baptism. The purpose of baptismal initiation is rebirth, a new creation, awakening from death, sleep and slumber, and into a new life in the spirit. Therefore, in the celebration of baptism, the washing with water should take on its full importance as the sign of that mystical sharing in Christ's death and resurrection through which those who believe in his name die to sin and rise to eternal life. (RCIA 213)

It is not the water that saves us, it is the story we tell and the mystery the water "signs" that saves us. It is the action of the divine persons, Father, Son, and Spirit, manifest in the water. It is the prayer of the minister and the people of God. It is the act of washing, the sacrament that saves us. It is the mystery of God's love that saves us.

What does baptism do? The easy answer is that it joins a person to Christ. The mystery answer takes some work. It takes a people of God, professing living faith in Christ's paschal mystery and using sacramental signs like washing God's beloved in water infused with divine mystery.

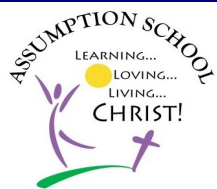

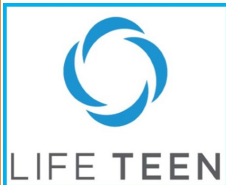

BECOME A MISSIONARY OF JOY!



The *Missionaries of Joy* is a new evangelization initiative forming lay leaders across the Archdiocese to help cultivate a vibrant culture of evangelization in every parish. Inspired by *Evangelii Gaudium* and aligned with Archbishop Rozanski’s vision document, *Disciples Make Disciples*, aims to equip parishioners to share their faith with joy, clarity, and confidence.

The program includes:

- A 12-course online curriculum following a monthly formation schedule with courses taught by Augustine Institute Graduate School of Theology professors in an engaging, self-paced, and in-depth format. This thorough curriculum focuses on three main areas of study: Scripture, doctrine, and the Christian life, and will provide you with a systematic overview of Catholic theology.
- Quarterly, in-person training days led by the Archdiocesan Office of Evangelization and Discipleship. Themes include: “The Moment” on our current missionary context; “The Message” focusing on the Kerygma and personal witness; “The Model” exploring discipleship pathways; and “The Method” featuring practical tools for evangelization in action.
