Hello,

Since Pope Leo XIV has been named pope, I know I've done numerous online searches on him and things related to him. The problem now is that when I go on YouTube, it will suggest all these different videos about him or articles pop up about him from different sources, and some of them, after I start reading a little, I know are blatantly wrong.

There was one last week that talked about learning about Pope Leo by looking at some of the bishops he is appointing. It started talking about one (that the author didn't like) and said some things that this bishop had done during Lent in his new diocese. The problem was Pope Leo wasn't pope until after Lent, so that source is on my 'don't bother with' list.

It gets harder and harder to sort through and identify what sources you can trust online and which ones you can't. Just today (I'm writing this a few weeks before leaving on vacation), I received notice that our Auxiliary Bishop Mark Rivituso was named Archbishop elect for the Archdiocese of Mobile, (a good example of a bishop Pope Leo is assigning). To find out a little about that archdiocese, I looked up their own website, and then also looked at some of their history on Catholic-Hierarchy.org. I can tell you that is a site I trust that gives mostly names and dates and statistics about dioceses and bishops throughout the world and their history. If I didn't believe the websites for the archdioceses of St. Louis or Mobile about this assignment I could go to the Vatican website (Vatican.va), and from there go to the Dicastery for Bishops and their website and then see who they appointed today and it had the same information about Bishop Rivituso's appointment.

That might seem a bit easy for names and dates type things, but it is also a place where you can find actual documents of what the Pope or others have said, or decrees and official documents that were issued. Unfortunately, we can't trust information to always be honest, so go to the original source if you need to verify. Like the websites of the dioceses themselves, USCCB.org (the website for the United States College of Catholic Bishops), or the Vatican website can be useful.

It can get a little more challenging when we are talking about news, commentaries and some educational material. Just like some people that we do trust because of the history we have with them, and others we don't, we need to consider what history we have with different sources online, and if we don't have any history, we need to be cautious about what we read or hear or even see. Formed.org is a website you have access to as a parishioner of Assumption that has plenty of information, education, and even entertainment (movies and books) about the Catholic Church that we endorse. Bishop Robert Barron has the Word on Fire website that also has a full variety of resources that you can trust. There are many other trustworthy sites that I would hope you share with others, as you find them.

You can get more complicated though in the new era of Artificial Intelligence (AI). One concern is that it can produce very convincing material that at times can be intended to mislead, but other times it might be able to quickly and very helpfully answer questions. But, can I rely on the answer? I just typed in a few questions on an AI service on the Hallow app and it gave some very good and accurate responses. But even with trusted sources for AI, just like any person you might ask, you shouldn't blindly accept responses, but consider if it heard your question correctly, and if the answer makes sense with what else you know. It is always good if it supplies you with reference sources you can check, (I don't think Jesus is going to be asking AI, "but who do you say that I am?"), confirm, and maybe look deeper into your question if you need to.

We are blessed with so much in our lives today, let's be sure to use them faithfully and responsibly in all the ways they can help us.

- Three new air conditioning units have been installed in the following classrooms: Mrs. Meier, Mrs. McDonald and Music/Spanish

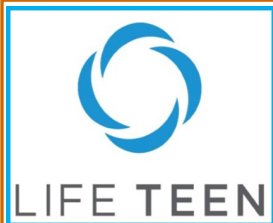
School Safety:

Safety is always a priority and while we have made huge improvements over the last two years, we continue to look for ways to ensure the safety and well-being of our students and staff. The following additional safety measures have been put into place this summer:

- We are replacing our aging phone system with a cloud-based system that works on cell phones if needed. This means we will not have a complete collapse of our phone service if our internet provider or electricity goes down.
- Additional interior and exterior cameras are being installed around campus
- Mrs. Burbridge and Mr. Vogt will be working on a security grant through the Archdiocese to support window coverings and additional safety measures around campus.

The admin team is hard at work this summer to ensure a smooth transition into the start of the 2025-2026 school year. We continue to work on academic growth, technology, extra curricular activities and faith based experiences. At Assumption we are committed to nurturing the whole child—academically, socially, emotionally, and spiritually. We look forward to growing together in faith, building community, and partnering with you to support another successful school year at Assumption!

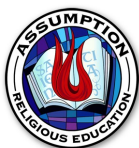
