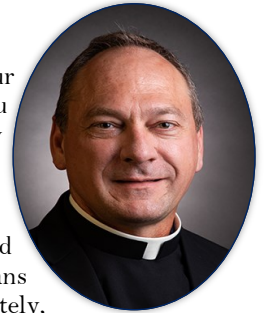

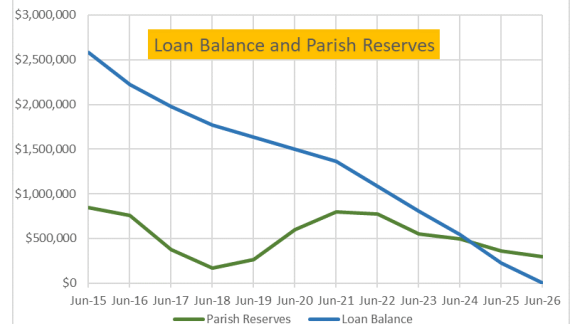
This week our annual report is available to provide a summary of our financial and sacramental information over the last fiscal year. You can see in the table on this page a summary of our financial history over the last five years including our budgeted numbers for this current fiscal year (7/1/2025-6/30/2026).



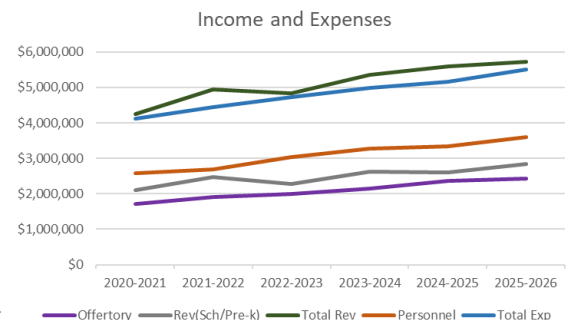
An area that might get your attention is that we have a few red numbers in the lower column of our yearly Surplus/Deficit which means what you might expect, we spent more than we brought in. Fortunately, our parish has maintained the reserves, or savings, to be able to pay those deficits and our Net Income (our operating surplus before taking out the loan principle we are paying down) has remained positive. Since our loan will be paid off this year, we will hopefully be able to start building up our reserves again.

I'm very grateful that our offertory has continued to increase, both due to regular donations as well as generous bequests, these are critical to the operation of our parish. We have also seen an increase in our number of students in the school and preschool over the past few years, helping to pay our school expenses while keeping tuition affordable.



One addition to our campus this last year is a new playground located between the chapel and our Early Childhood Building. This proved a popular focus for fundraising efforts last year, this as well as the efforts of many in the planning and building of the playground have made it a great success that our children are putting to good use.

ADULT FAITH NIGHT DIFFICULT MORAL QUESTIONS

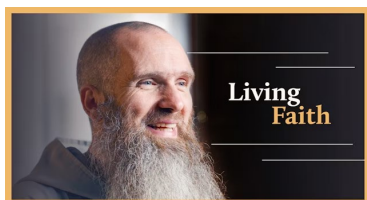
- *Should I attend my brother's third wedding?*

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (OCIA)

The Inquiry/Precatechumenate is a phase in the Christian Initiation process where individuals explore the Catholic faith. We are blessed this year with 12 individuals who are inquiring about our faith. Our team has been helping them get in touch with where they are in their faith journey - the tug they feel on their heart, and desire to seek faith. 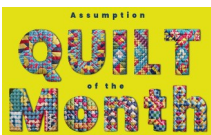
