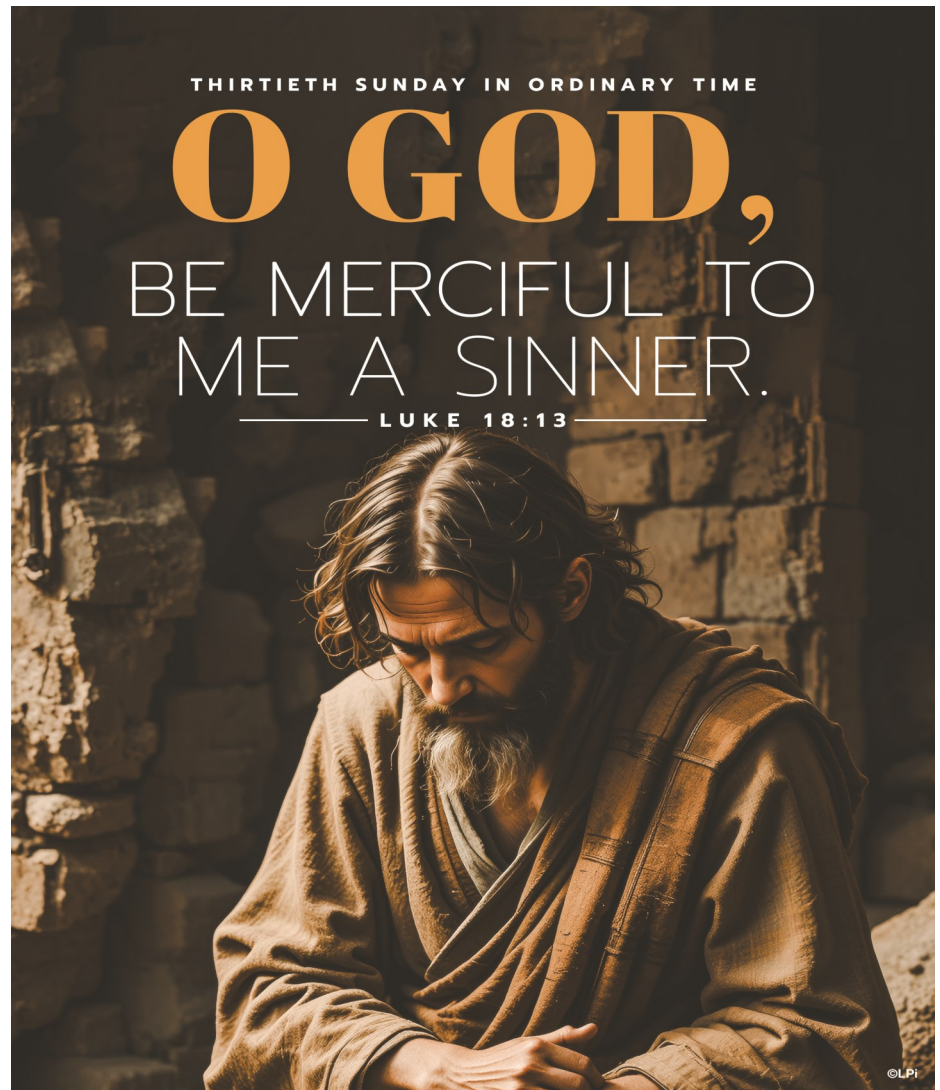

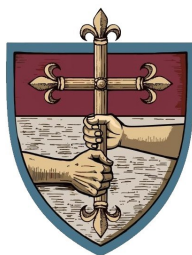

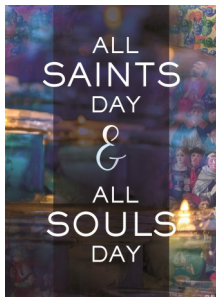
PRAY THE ROSARY BEFORE WEEKEND MASSES

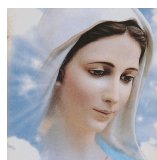

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (OCIA)

"I believe in Jesus Christ, his (God the Father's) only Son, our Lord; who was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary." The catechetical cycle, which we have been studying, makes constant reference to the truth expressed by the Apostle's Creed that we have just quoted. These words present Christ as true God—Son of the Father—and at the same time as true man, son of the Virgin Mary. The preceding catecheses offered the opportunity of examining this fundamental truth of faith. Our present study intends to deepen our understanding of the essential elements of such a truth. We must seek to penetrate the significance of the statement "true God and true man." This is a reality that is revealed for our consideration through the self-revelation of God in Jesus Christ.
